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General Observations

- From Air Traffic Perspective
 - Impact on nonparticipating traffic overall was minimal
 - Most issues occurred where we thought they would
- From an FAA Perspective
 - No complaints from industry
 - Few public affairs calls



More Specific

- Air Traffic Facilities
 - Need a rep. from each impacted ARTCC at the mid/final planning conferences
 - Need to be more proactive in taking advantage of training applications
 - Need to insure info is passed to next impacted ATC facility, whether on the Domestic Event Net or not



More Specifics

- FAA/NORAD Procedural Issues
 - Handling of intercept aircraft
 - FAA shall maintain control of intercept until AFIO is declared.
 - ANR incorrectly assumed control and vectored fighters to TOI.
 - In Seattle ARTCC airspace, FAA controller placed in middle of relaying instructions between WADS and fighters.



More Specifics

- FAA/NORAD Procedures
 - ADLO position in CMOC a "work in progress"
 - Too many folks calling same source
 - Need to delineate responsibility in the command center
 - Will improve when permanents arrive



More Specifics

FAA/TSA Issues

- Will the Hijack Conference be activated? Is it still necessary?
- Should it be rolled into the Noble Eagles?
- Who asks NORAD for assistance when/if a TOI has been declared a hijack?
- Do we (FAA/TSA) have the right level of participation on the conferences?



Other Noticeable Issues

- Command Center is "blind"
 - Web-based Situational Display and Flight Explorer just don't cut it.
 - Have to get Traffic Situation Display or some other realtime tool installed ASAP
- Security Control of Air Traffic and Air Navigation Aids (SCATANA)
 - If right players are on the conferences, couldn't the decision be made there?

- Were not supposed to be date specific to preclude any unwanted attention as directed by the CINC
- On May 31, however, a local newspaper for Ottawa,
 Canada, reported the AV would take place on June 4.
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
